Also, I want to state for the record that the amount of time which I have thus far dedicated to this one proposal, among others, is absolutely nothing compared to the amount of time I witnessed peace activists over months and months devote and volunteer for free in various peace activist projects, only to see those projects fall apart as a direct result of unequal sweat equity. If you are devoted to creating a world of peace, please join us by creating personal summaries.

If you submit your email address, you will be included on the personal summary email list. Personal summaries are very flexible. A Personal Summary can simply consist of a description of the meeting. Or, it could consist of a description of what you have done in the last two weeks to help the group get closer to creating The Networking for Peace Multicultural Cohousing Resource Neighborhood. Or, it could consist of a story that you read in a book, zine, magazine or a newspaper. (However, for copyright reasons we ask that you paraphrase the story in your own words and make certain that it is not longer than 1000 words. In addition, please give credit to the author of the story).

In closing, as we are a multicultural group, with an emphasis on diversity, it is worth noting that

Multicultural communicative democracy is being used for many reasons. One of these reasons is that it has several distinguishing features, which would limit the lack of participation by those in the minority. In Young's book, "Communication and the Other: Beyond Deliberative Democracy", she encourages people to use greetings, which would make people feel more comfortable in participating.

Young notes that greetings "bring people together warmly, seeing conditions for amicability: smiles, handshakes, hugs, the giving and taking of food and drink." 1

Our practice of communicative democracy is why we request that every member bring some type of food item to our once

a month Networking for Peace meetings.






We ask that each member please purchase and bring food or drink to the meeting. This helps every meeting to be more like a potluck made of light snacks, rather

than a very formal, and rigid office meeting. Because of the diverse eating habits of our group members, it is recommended that every member simply bring enough fruits or vegetables as a snack for 5-8 people. You can also choose to bring a light vegan snack or vegetarian snack for 5-8 people. Bringing food to meetings, to share as a gift with the group, actually helps the communicative process while breaking the expense of one person providing the entire group with food and then collecting a 'food fee' as is common in many activist groups.

The following paragraph details how important sharing stories can be:

Second, [Young] proposes including rhetoric, which would connect people's emotions to the speaker and make the discussion less boring.** Finally, she proposes including storytelling. This is the most important of the three ways to include minorities in the discourse, because it is something everyone can participate in.*** Young notes, allowing people to tell stories of their own personal experience, not only encourages participation, but encourages those in the majority to see a multiplicity of perspectives. "Narrative also contributes to political argument by the social knowledge it offers of how social segments view one another's actions and what are the likely effects of policies and actions on people in different social locations."**** Thus, Young's proposal adds greater depth to the possibility for a truly participatory democracy.



When writing your personal summaries, please understand that your writing may include personal stories instead of, or in addition to any of the following:

- Descriptions of the meeting you attended
- Descriptions of how you have worked to help create The Networking for Peace Multicultural Cohousing Resource Neighborhood.
- Descriptions of how you have read and studied books, magazines or websites which taught you more about peace, cohousing, diversity and any other topics that you choose.
- Personal descriptions of your life, your triumphs, moments of celebrations, moments of sorrow, your heartbreaks and your hope for a better world.

Below is a sample of a personal summary with 391 words:

On **Monday**, **March 14**, **2003** we had a two-hour meeting from 1pm-3pm at the group.

On Tuesday, March 15, 2003 or Wednesday March 16, Miguel, Patricia and I began talking about the

Networking for Peace when the cafe was packed and we didn't leave until we were the last ones there and the chairs were up and the café was closed.

On **Thursday, March 17** Patricia and I began talking about the Networking for Peace when the cafe was mostly packed and we didn't leave until we were the last ones there, the chairs were up and the café was closed. I pulled out part one of four for this draft, and Patricia pulled out a piece of paper with her thoughts in tiny print and it filled both sides of the paper. I asked, "How many hours did you spend on that?" She said "5 or 6." She also pulled out the 3-page budget for 2004-2005 in which she had devoted research time.

On the afternoon of **Friday**, **March 18** I began writing my rough draft for the fundraiser idea. I printed out the draft for the grant, the draft for this proposal, and several lists of prices.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Notice in the below paragraph how the writer shares with the reader the small, but significant sacrifices. What our group lacks in wealth, we will make up with heartfelt honesty, sacrifice and dedication to our mission of peace. This is how we will create a multicultural peace movement.

Saturday, March 18 I used some change to travel on Trimet 45 minutes to go to a place that I know will let me use a computer to further edit these proposals and make unlimited free print outs without scrutiny, time limits or harassment. I then used some change to get back home.

I have been receiving emails and replying to emails throughout all of these days but I don't want to list all of the emails. But because the time devoted to emails by a volunteer is significant I want to give you a sample of one day:

On **Monday, March 28**, at 10:30am I noticed only 4 new emails and replied to them. Between 10:30am and 4pm, while trying to write the proposals in a separate window, on that same day I received 14 new emails and I replied to each one with a reply of 2 lines to 2 pages each at a typing speed of less than 45 words per minute. Those 18 emails were from Catherine, Patricia, Donald, James, Jessica and Yenta. Each one sending me a minimum of 2 emails and each receiving a reply.

In the personal summaries, if you have a conflict or a disagreement, please do not name anyone's name. This is to prevent the personal summaries from being used to facilitate personal attacks, even if it is done accidentally.

Below is another sample of a personal summary with 137 words. It is entirely fictional.

The meeting was great. I heard some things that I did not agree with. Cohousing is supposed to be about creating a home with all our input. But when I made the suggestion that all walls should be made of transparent, plastic glass, it was not too popular. At our last monthly meeting I suggested that we all

vote on the idea of the entire neighborhood being built with 100% transparent, plastic glass walls. This week we voted on it and I was the only one who voted "yes" to have 100% transparent, plastic glass walls. One member even said it was an idea that put everyone's safety and privacy at risk. I think someday

people will make homes out of all transparent, plastic glass, because it will

create an environment of knocking down 'walls' between us.
